IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – Meeting of July 12, 2024, October 11, 2024, and November 15, 2024

Motion Made by Mr. Flavien to approve the minutes of the July 12, 2024, October 11, 2024, and November 15, 2024, meetings and seconded by Mr. Edmonson. In a voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

 Chairperson Vilches-Landa opened the meeting for a reasonable opportunity to be heard. There being no speaker cards presented; Chairperson Vilches-Landa closed the public comment period.

VI. COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

 Chair Vilches provided an update on Brightline's pedestrian footbridge project at the Aventura rail station. The bridge is now scheduled for completion by Thanksgiving 2025. It will improve safety and connectivity by allowing pedestrians to cross Biscayne Boulevard safely. Once completed, it will provide direct access to the county transit hub and Aventura Mall, which attracts 28 million visitors annually.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

- A. Motion to Recommend Approval Fiscal Year 2026-2031 Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) priorities list
 - Loraine Cargill of SFRTA and Vikas Jain of TYlin Group presented the VA Medical Center Station project, a proposed station 3 miles west of the Mangonia Park Station, located on CSX and SFRC tracks.

Discussion Points:

- Ridership is projected to reach 645–705 daily boardings in 2029, increasing to 900–1,200 by 2045.
- Estimated capital cost is \$86.8 million (excluding a pedestrian bridge), with annual O&M costs of \$3–5 million, requiring local funding.
- TRIP List Adjustments:

- o Miami-Dade removed Vison Zero projects from MDC-2.
- Funding adjustments were made for Park & Ride Facility at SW 344thST.
- Updates to SFRTA expansion project description to specify Mangonia Park to VA Medical Center.
- **Motion** made by Mr. Uhlir and seconded by Mr. Flavien to approve the amended TRIP List. In voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.

VIII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. SFRTA's Capital Requests along the SFRC Corridor- Open Discussion

 Mr. Gies opened a discussion on aligning funding from multiple MPOs for capital improvement projects, such as station security upgrades, track enhancements, and transit safety projects for SFRTA.

B. 2025 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Update

Jessica Josselyn of Kittleson & Associations provided an update on RTP regional modeling, accessibility analysis and financial analysis.

- Review of schedule and next steps:
- Performance assessment of the 2045 LRTP in underway.
- Revenue & finance technical memos finalized.
- Modeling and accessibility analysis are in progress.

• Discussion on the RTP final product format:

- Options considered:
 - 1. Traditional print/PDF format.
 - 2. Hybrid model (web-based executive summary + downloadable report).
 - 3. Full interactive website (live updates, integrated data, downloadable resources).
- Members will recommend a final decision in February.

III. Approval of Agenda

IV. Approval of Minutes of July 19th, 2024

V. Public Comments

Ken Jeffries of FDOT District 6 and Ron Kareiva of FDOT District 4 stated that the current focus should be on a general multimodal study rather than a PD&E (Project Development and Environment) study. They emphasized that funding for a future PD&E will be prioritized only after the multimodal study is completed. Aileen Boucle, Executive Director of Miami-Dade TPO, supported this approach. They confirmed that there is a multimodal plan included in the district 4 budget, specifically within the SIS unfunded needs plan. They highlighted the importance of establishing logical termini, developing a clear purpose and need, and assessing feasibility before proceeding to PD&E.

VIII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) - Update

Jessica Josselyn of Kittleson & Associates provided an update on the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) on behalf of Francesca Taylor. She covered the project schedule and coordination, highlighting that the plan is on track for adoption in summer 2025.

Jocelyn presented the regional transportation investment, estimating over \$78 billion through 2050, with about \$61 billion after excluding discretionary funds. She encouraged feedback on notable projects for inclusion in the RTP. Key projects highlighted included:

- Miami-Dade: Golden Glades Interchange, North/Northeast Corridor, and US-1 safety improvements.
- Broward: US-27, County Line and Turnpike Extension, and Powerline Road.
- Palm Beach: Okeechobee Boulevard feasibility study, transit signal priority projects, and US-1 improvements.

IX. ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Aileen Boucle, Executive Director of the Miami-Dade TPO acknowledged the hard work of all MPO/TPO staff, expressing appreciation for their collaborative efforts. Greg noted the pleasure of working together and congratulated Valerie on her recent accomplishments, commending her, the staff, and consultants for their excellent work during this exciting time for the region and Palm Beach.

Gregory Stuart, Executive Director of the Broward MPO also pointed out that the Broward portion of the plan does not currently mention the southeastern section of the commuter rail but assured that it will be incorporated in a tailored manner that

aligns with Broward's LRTP in the future. He emphasized the importance of not prematurely committing to specifics since the MPO has not yet identified this aspect.

Valerie Neilson, Executive Director of the Palm Beach TPA announced plans for a bike immersion program during the week of the April SEFTC meeting, seeking to explore alternative dates for scheduling. This program aims to engage a smaller group, ideally including three MPO directors and three to four board members from each group.
