I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Vice Chair Furr called the meeting to order at 9:54 a.m.

II. ROLL CALL

Ms. Taylor called the roll of SEFTC members. All members were present, the quorum was met.

III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Motion made by Vice Furr, seconded by Board Member Reed, to approve. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES - Meeting of November 11, 2022

Motion made by Vice Chair Furr, seconded by Board Member Reed, to approve. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments.

VI. COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

In honor of Black History Month, Vice-Chair Furr read out for the Council a historical fact that was provided by the TPO about Frederick McKinley-Jones. "The next time you enjoy a meal, you may want to thank Frederick McKinley Jones. That's because he patented the mechanical transport refrigeration unit, which made it possible for long haul trucks and railroad cars to transport fresh and frozen foods around the world. In 1991, President George H.W. Bush posthumously awarded Jones the National Medal of Technology, making him the first Black American to receive the honor."

Vice-Chair Furr introduced the new Miami-Dade TPO Chair Esteban Bovo, Jr. as the Miami-Dade TPO Representative. Board Member Bovo spoke about the Achilles Heel for South Florida which is our ability to move people and goods due to our traffic issues. Board Member Bovo also spoke about the creation of synergy between the three counties.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Motion to Elect Officers to serve from February 2023 through January 2024

Board Member Reed nominated Vice Chair Furr for Chair, who accepted. The call to vote followed, and Mr. Furr was elected, 3-0.

Board Member Bovo nominated Board Member Reed for Vice-Chair, who accepted. The call to vote followed, and Ms. Reed was elected. 3-0.

B. Motion to Approve the Fiscal Year 2024 – 2029 Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) List

Vice Chair Furr brought forth the TRIP list of items that need to go before this board. Board Member Bovo asked if any of the projects on the list involve the expansion of toll toads.

Motion made by Board Member Bovo, seconded by Vice Chair Furr to approve. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

VIII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. 2050 Regional Transportation Plan Update

Ms. Taylor introduced herself as the Project Manager for this cycle and conducted a presentation of the 4th Regional Transportation Plan highlighted by the following:

- SEFTC Mission & Vision
- Three Counties, One Traveling Public
- Past Adopted Plans
 - o 2010, 2015, 2020
- Scope of Work will focus on:
 - Public Participation Now through Summer 2025
 - o Regional Goals, Objectives, and Targets *March-June 2023*
 - Regional Transportation Network March-June 2023
 - Scenario Development and Analysis March 2023-December 2024
 - SEFTC Support Now through Summer 2025

Ms. Bouclé requested a pause for Ms. Taylor to formerly introduce herself to the SEFTC. Ms. Taylor, Program Development Manager at the TPO introduced herself and Mr. Edmonson as the co-lead for the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and the consultant support through Ms. Josselyn.

Vice Chair Furr asked for the confirmation for adoption date. Ms. Taylor responded that they kicked off in January and will be coming to the SEFTC for adoption in Summer 2025.

Vice Chair Furr asked if there were any boxes that can be checked. Ms. Bouclé stated that we have a major accomplishment through our 2045 document and partnership with the Broward MPO to regionally prioritize the Northeast Corridor, and funds have recently been received from FDOT that are consistent with this Board's vision on regional priorities on getting funds committed and programmed. Each of the MPOs commit set aside funds through the respective UPWP's to do this regional effort.

B. Coastal Link Update

Ms. Bian of Miami-Dade Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) for the Northeast Corridor and Mr. Schwab (FDOT District 4 in-house consultant) for the Broward Commuter Rail (BCR) project conducted a join presentation highlighted by the following:

- History of the Corridor
- Project Overview for the Locally Preferred Alternative for BCR South
- Rail Transit Alternatives Considered
 - Metro Rapid Transit
 - Commuter Rail
 - Intercity Rail
- Corridor Users
 - Freight Up to 24 trains daily
 - o Brightline (Intercity rail) 36 trains daily
 - o SFRTA Tri-Rail (Commuter rail) 28 trains daily
 - Northeast Corridor (Planned commuter rail) 54 trains daily (approx.)
- Proposed Stations
- NE Corridor-BCR South Project Coordination
- BCR South and NE Corridor Grant Approach
- Schedule

During the presentation, Ms. Bian and Mr. Schwab fielded questions from the floor.

- Board Member Bovo asked about the status of Tri-Rail service to Downtown Miami.
- Vice Chair Furr inquired about access agreements
- Board Member Bovo commented that residents want to see movement, not studies.
- Vice Chair Furr commented that this project represents the spine of the Palm Beach County network.
- Ms. Neilson encouraged oordination between the three county transit agencies

C. SEFTC Grants Mechanism Discussion

Ms. Bouclé stated that this item was placed on the agenda to have the discussion and obtain a consensus on the multiple funding opportunities that are coming up to advance our regional Northeast Corridor. With the TPO now in the rotating leadership role as these funding opportunities arise, the goal is convening this board for the purpose of signing letters of support across the region for any of the projects that are ready to pursue funds. Ms. Bouclé said that this was previously done in 2015 by SEFTC and that we need to meet in between our quarterly meetings to that there is an agreement to sign letters of support that push forward at the regional level.

Vice Chair Furr mentioned that there are several grants coming up on a monthly basis that need to be prepared for.

Ms. Bouclé said that getting letters of support from this body would present a unified front.

Board Member Reed said that this is an opportunity for the three counties collaborating and to have several voices together.

Vice Chair Furr mentioned in addition that both the South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) and the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) have been working together a lot recently so we need to add their voices so that brings the total to seven (7) counties that provides more leverage.

Board Member Reed inquired if it was possible to loop the TCRPC into these calls to which Ms. Bouclé obliged and Vice Chair Furr strongly requested that we do so.

Vice Chair Furr asked about what would be done about letters of support that are needed prior to the SEFTC next meeting in May.

Ms. Bouclé stated that if this board has already authorized this, then it would be just a matter of the three Executive Directors convening virtually to develop a letter of support then seeking a signature from the SEFTC to submit with a federal grant. If it is on this TRIP list, then we would automatically agree that letters of support will be going towards those projects.

Mr. Libhaber opined that a motion could be carried out but that a meeting of two or more of the SEFTC members for the purpose of reviewing and approving drafts would require 48-hour notice. The meeting could be done virtually via Zoom, etc.

Motion made by Vice Chair Furr for authorization to approve letter of service for items that are already included on the TRIP and RTP, seconded by Board Member Bovo, and passed unanimously.
