**III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

- The agenda for today's meeting was passed unanimously.

**IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – Meeting of January 7, 2026**

- The agenda for the January 7, 2026 meeting was passed unanimously.

## V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Chair Vilches-Landa opened the meeting for the reasonable opportunity to be heard and seeing no one appearing to speak, the public comment period was closed.

## VI. COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

- Chair Vilches-Landa provided comments in recognition of Black History Month, highlighting the contributions of Garrett Morgan, an African American inventor who in 1923 invented the three-position traffic signal introduced the modern “warning” phase and significantly advanced roadway safety. She noted that Morgan’s innovation laid the foundation for today’s traffic control systems and serves as a reminder of how creativity and equity-driven innovation can shape safer and more connected transportation networks for future generations.

## VII. ACTION ITEMS

### A. Motion to Recommend Approval of Amended Fiscal Year 2027-2032 Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) Priorities List

- Miami-Dade DTPW requested revisions via a letter to the Miami-Dade TPO to the previously approved TRIP list, including:
  - Reassigning two existing Miami-Dade projects to the South Dade Trail Park and Ride (FY '31-'32) and the Palmetto TOC (FY '28). Mr. Uhlir and Ms. Cargill both requested clarification on funding and FDOT’s decision on which projects are awarded.
  - Construction for the Palmetto TOC planned to begin July 1, 2027, led by a private developer, with TRIP funds supporting 550 public parking spaces. This marks one of the first uses of TRIP funds for public parking within a private development.
  - Members expressed both support for leveraging TRIP funds for transit-oriented development and concerns regarding limited funding.
  - Tri-Rail projects remain listed as higher priorities than DTPW requests
- **Motion** made by Mr. Uhlir and **seconded** by Mr. Flavien; in a voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.

**B. Recommended Approval of the SEFTC Agenda**

- Members were informed the SEFTC meeting time was adjusted to 1:30 p.m. at the request of Chair Furr.
- Motion made by Mr. Flavien and Seconded by Mr. Uhlir, motion passed unanimously.

**VIII. INFORMATION ITEMS**

**A. 2055 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) MOU and Scope Update**

- Minor changes were made to the MOU based on comments from Miami-Dade TPO and Broward MPO.
- The Final MOU final MOU is circulating for signatures in the following order: Broward MPO → Miami-Dade TPO → Palm Beach MPO.

**B. FY 27-28 UPWP Update**

- Updated indicate all MPOs are nearing completion.
- Regional updates included confirmation of SERPM 10 funding splits between FDOT Districts 4 and 6.
- Mr. Uhlir will distribute the latest draft for final consistency review before submission to FDOT

**D. Modeling Subcommittee (MS)**

- VISUM training was held January 26, 2026 for all MPO's and FDOT staff.
- Positive feedback received; preparation is now underway for SERPM 10, which will incorporate AI-assisted tools. FDOT is leading the SERPM 10 development with the consultant team.

**E. Transportation System Management and Operations Subcommittee (TSM&O)**

- Mr. Rosenberg mentioned that the last meeting was a virtual workshop; no major updates.

**X. MEMBER'S COMMENTS**

- SEFTC meeting is scheduled for February 20, 2026, at 1:30 PM at Palm Beach MPO. TRIP list will be presented to SEFTC for approval.
- Reminder that the last day to place an application into the FDOT GAP system is on February 27<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Jeffries noted for applicants to make sure that their login ID and passwords are up to date.
- Ms. Delaney raised a question was raised regarding US-27 and whether SEFTC will issue a letter of support; at present FDOT has no appetite to advance the project despite regional interest.
- SFRTA Announced a groundbreaking ceremony for its TOD project, Link at Boca tomorrow at 1:30 PM.

**III. REVIEW OF AGENDA**

**IV. REVIEW OF MINUTES – Meeting of February 11, 2026**

- The minutes from the February 11, 2026 meeting were reviewed. Approval was deferred to the next in-person meeting on April 8, 2026.

**V. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

- No public comments were received.

**VI. COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR**

- Chair Vilches-Landa provided comments on Bicycle Month in Florida and International Women’s Day a moment to honor the incredible women who have shaped the world of cycling and paved the way for today’s riders. From pioneers like **Annie Londonderry**, who famously circled the globe on two wheels, to trailblazers such as **Beryl Burton** and **Tillie Anderson**, whose strength and determination shattered records and defied expectations, their stories continue to inspire countless women to ride with confidence, purpose, and joy. These historic cyclists not only transformed the sport but also advanced mobility, independence, and safety—values that guide our transportation mission here in South Florida

**VII. INFORMATION ITEMS**

**A. 2055 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) MOU and Scope Update**

- Mr. Uhrir provided an update. The MOU has been signed by all three regional MPOs. The MOU outlines the funding that is to be committed in the upcoming work program starting in fiscal year '28. Since the last RTTAC meeting, the SERPM 10 team has coordinated one-on-one meetings with each MPO. One of the things that the Palm Beach MPO stressed during this meeting is scenario planning for digital twins data and potential scenario planning around events/tourism. Our model currently runs off of AADT so it is not a peak hour model, therefore something to consider is to ensure that the SERPM team is prepared to run peak hour volumes and additional data for special events that are already occurring. The Palm Beach MPO is still working towards a draft scope of services that can be provided to RTTAC members by next month.
- Mr. Flavien provided a point of clarification. The current SERPM model produces 5 time periods, which include peak hour period volumes. The output sums it up as AADT volumes.
- Chair Vilches-Landa informed members that on March 30th there will be an in-person RTTAC MS meeting followed by a workshop in afternoon with both FDOTs, all three MPO members and SERPM 10 development team.

**B. FY 2027-28 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Update**

- All three MPOs have been developing UPWP and have been coordinating on regional sections that impact the collective group.
- Mr. Rosenberg provided an update on the Miami-Dade TPO. The TPO has

completed their Draft UPWP and the document was submitted to FDOT (District 6) for review on February 27<sup>th</sup>. This included the regional task, which the TPO commends all MPO members for their coordination efforts and ensuring a very smooth process. Awaiting for comments from FDOT. Scheduled to have the UPWP adopted at the April TPO Governing Board Meeting.

- Mr. Flavien provided update on the Broward MPO. The MPO is on track to be completed as originally scheduled. The Draft UPWP is currently on the MPO website. They expect to submit the Draft into GAP after adoption at MPO Governing Board meeting tomorrow, March 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Mr. Uhlir provided an update on the Palm Beach MPO. The final version of the UPWP is being presented to the MPO Governing Board next Thursday, March 19<sup>th</sup>. They are still awaiting comments from FDOT and FHWA. If need changes are required due to comments, the UPWP will be amended later on.

### **C. Recap of the 2026 Safe Roads Summit**

- Mr. Flavien provided a summary of the 2026 Safe Roads Summit hosted by the Broward MPO. There were 450-500 attendees and it was a wonderful event. They had speakers from USDOT, Google, universities, etc. The summit also had a number of great workshops.
- Mr. Walford stated on behalf of the Miami-Dade TPO that the summit was a great event that staff enjoyed attending.
- Mr. Uhlir congratulated the Broward MPO on a great event, including great speakers and mobile tours. He enquired on obtaining more information on the Digital Twin breakout and was hoping to discuss this topic further in the future.
- Mr. Flavien has made the request for the digital twin discussion and it will be presented/discussed at a future RTTAC meeting.
- Chair Vilches-Landa stated that the 2027 Summit will be held in Miami.

## **VIII. COMMITTEE REPORTS (no Discussion)**

### **A. Public Participation Subcommittee (PPS)**

- No activity this period

### **B. Modeling Subcommittee (MS)**

- The current SERPM 9 is in maintenance and there have been enhancements being made. One enhancement is that the model runs faster now. The model can be run between 14-15 hours with a computer with high Gigabyte capacity. The next meeting for RTTAC-MS is on March 30<sup>th</sup> in the morning and then the

workshop for the current SERPM effort in the afternoon.

**C. TSM&O Subcommittee**

- There have been no changes since the last RTTAC meeting. The next meeting is currently scheduled for April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Due to some scheduling conflicts with multiple core documents up for adoption at the TPO Governing Board, the team will be looking at rescheduling that date.

**IX. MEMBER COMMENTS**

- The next RTTAC meeting is scheduled for April 8<sup>th</sup> at the Broward MPO offices at 1:30pm.
- The next SEFTC meeting is scheduled for April 24<sup>th</sup> at the Broward MPO offices at 9:30am
- Mr. Uhlir mentioned that the Palm Beach MPO will be hosting the Joint Regional Planning Councils with the Treasure Coast and South Florida Regional Planning Council on April 10<sup>th</sup>.
- Mr. Uhlir also mentioned the upcoming Tomorrow City USA event being held in West Palm Beach on April 14-15<sup>th</sup>.
- Chair Vilches-Landa mentioned that she was aware of an autonomous vehicle event happening in Boca Raton at the end of May. More information will be provided at the April 8<sup>th</sup> meeting.

**Regular Items**  
**(All Items Open for Public Comment)**

**I. Call to Order**

Chair Furr called the meeting to order at 1:45PM.

Chair Furr provided comments on the celebration of Black History Month, we honor **Garrett Morgan**, a true pioneer in transportation safety. Morgan, an African American inventor, revolutionized traffic management by creating one of the first

three-position traffic signals in 1923, a design that introduced the concept of a ‘warning’ light to improve roadway safety. His innovation laid the foundation for modern traffic control systems, helping to save countless lives and shape the way we move today. Morgan’s legacy reminds us that ingenuity and vision can transform communities and create safer, more connected transportation networks for all. Let his story inspire us to continue building a future where innovation and equity drive progress for generations to come.

## II. Roll Call

Mr. Moyse called the roll of SEFTC members. Chair Furr, Vice Chair Drucker and Board member Diaz-Padron were present.

## III. Approval of Agenda

**Motion** made by Councilwoman Drucker, seconded by Mayor Eric Diaz-Padron to approve. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

## IV. Approval of Minutes of October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2025

**Motion** made by Councilwoman Drucker, seconded by Mayor Eric Diaz-Padron to approve. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

## V. Public Comments

During the public comment period, Chair Furr expressed his interest in receiving a presentation to better understand the current developments at SFRTA. Councilwoman Drucker provided a comprehensive “State of Tri-Rail” update, noting that Tri-Rail is funded in this year’s state budget, though the funding is not retroactive. She also explained that MPO financial contributions will remain unchanged for now, and that Tri-Rail’s fare structure is under review, with possible fare increases to \$6.50–\$7.00. Councilwoman Drucker emphasized that, despite positive developments at the legislative level, ongoing advocacy remains critical to reinforce Tri-Rail’s importance as a regional mobility asset.

She also shared updates from the City of Boca Raton, noting that the city recently broke ground on The Link at Boca Raton, a transit-oriented development expected to serve as a model for additional TODs that can help offset Tri-Rail’s operating costs. Finally, she highlighted encouraging shifts in state-level discussions, with Tallahassee beginning to include more language related to multimodal and rail alternatives.

## VII. ACTION ITEMS

### A. **Motion to Elect Officers** Chair & Vice Chair to serve from February 2026 through January 2027

Chair Furr expressed interest in continuing for another year.

Motion to appoint Beam Furr as Chair by Mayor Diaz-Padron, seconded by Councilwoman Drucker. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Drucker expressed desire to serve as Vice Chair for the remainder of her MPO term. Mayor Diaz-Padron also expressed interest but deferred in recognition of his longer term.

**Motion** to appoint Councilwoman Drucker as Vice Chair by Mayor Diaz-Padron, seconded by Chair Furr. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

### B. **Motion to Approve** the Fiscal Year 2027-2032 Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP) priorities List

Mr. Rosenberg clarified that the vote covers the entire TRIP list to be forwarded to FDOT. He noted that this year's list exceeds available funding; FDOT will ultimately determine the final prioritized list. He also mentioned that although the TRIP list is typically balanced as zero, this year there are projects that exceeded the allowable funds. FDOT, who will be the ultimate reviewer of this document, will make the final decision and prioritize the projects.

**Motion** to approve by Mayor Diaz-Padron, seconded by Councilwoman Drucker. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

## VIII. INFORMATION ITEMS

### A. **US-27 Multi Modal Planning Study**

Chair Furr asked whether there had been any movement on the US-27 project. In response, Ms. Peters explained that FDOT's current position is that no study

will advance at this time; however, she emphasized that MPOs should continue including the corridor in priority lists, LOPPs, and LRTPs so momentum is not lost. She added that establishing consensus on the final project limits would strengthen the case for a future study and noted that FDOT will not discourage continued regional dialogue about the corridor.

Chair Furr also observed that the existing 10-year contract between FEC and Miami-Dade County for waste transport poses challenges for potential passenger rail service along that alignment.

Mr. Gies inquired about whether FDOT's inability to guarantee funding is tied to the newer policy requiring construction funding to be identified before a PD&E Study can begin.

Ms. Peters clarified that PD&E must commence within 18 months once programmed and construction funding must be identified within eight years of the study's start, meaning that, regardless of these constraints, the US-27 study would not have been included in this funding cycle.

## **IX. ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS**

### **A. Member Comments**

Mayor Diaz-Padron shared that he recently traveled to Tallahassee to meet with legislative representatives and remains optimistic about the upcoming session.

Councilwoman Drucker expressed enthusiasm for joining SEFTC, noting her six years of service as a Boca Raton Councilmember and her role as the city's transit champion. She also highlighted Boca Raton's autonomous vehicle pilot operating in Mizner Park near the Brightline Station, with an upcoming update planned for the next meeting, and a long-term goal of connecting the Tri-Rail Station to the Boca Raton Innovation Campus (BRIC).

executive Director Aileen Bouclé reported on her recent visit to Tallahassee during Transportation Day, where she discussed SunTrax's autonomous vehicle and urban air mobility testing efforts; SunTrax is actively seeking partners for pilot programs across the state., She requested to have SunTrax present to SEFTC and explain what they are working on and to go over what pilot projects they are looking to launch and how the MPOs can assist and partner with them.

Councilwoman Drucker added that a Vertiport pilot may soon be coming to FAU.

Chair Furr congratulated the Miami-Dade TPO on its bike program and ongoing safety initiatives.

Executive Director Valerie Neilson recognized Councilwoman Drucker's accomplishments, noting that Boca Raton received the largest amount of SSFA grant funds statewide, and she announced a mobile tour of Mizner Park on April 22 and an autonomous conference at the BRIC campus on May 29.

Mr. Gies highlighted the upcoming Safe Roads Summit, which has reached 500 registrants and includes a Technology and Innovation forum as a key component.

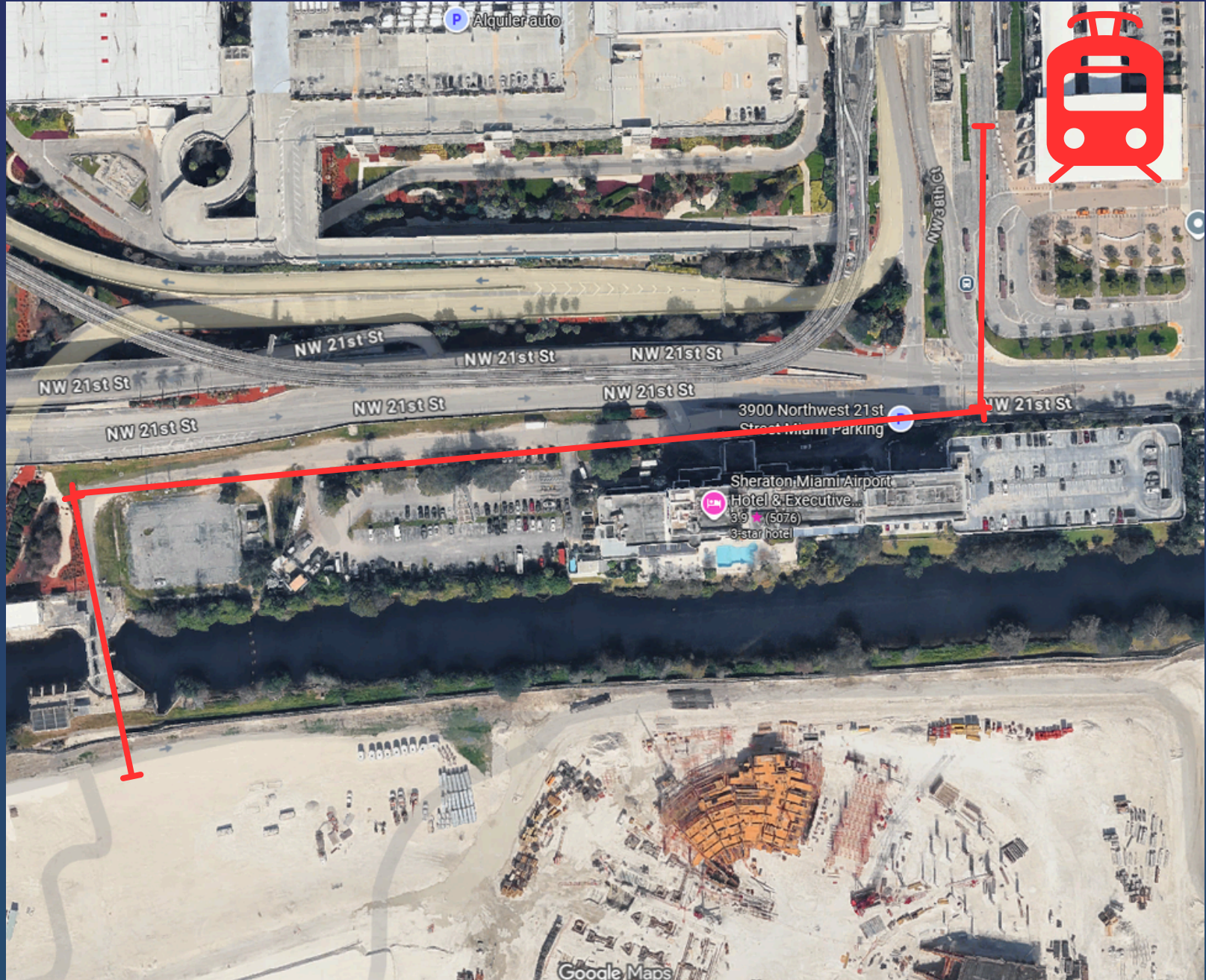

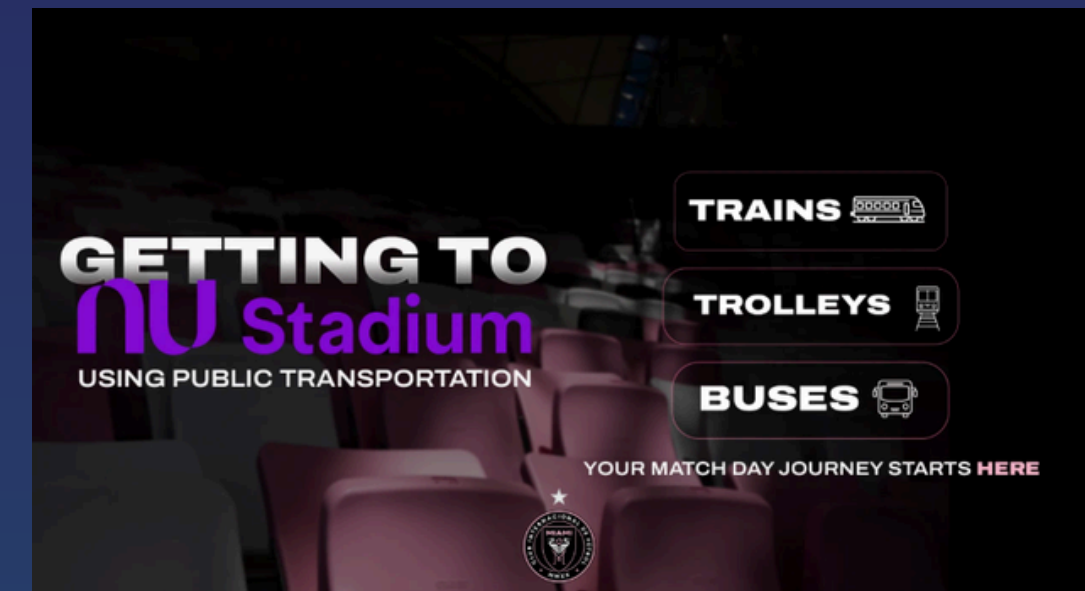
