III. Approval of Agenda

Motion made by Mr. Edmonson to approve the agenda and seconded by Mr. Gies. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

IV. Approval of Minutes – February 17, 2024, March 13, 2019, April 10, 2024, and June 12, 2024

Motion made by Mr. Uhlir to approval the minutes of the February 17, 2024, March 13, 2019, April 10, 2024, and June 12, 2024 meetings and seconded by Mr. Gies. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

V. Public Comments

Chairperson Vilches-Landa opened the meeting for the reasonable opportunity to be heard. There being no speaker cards presented, Chairperson Vilches-Landa closed the public comment period.

VI. Comments from the Chair

Chairperson Vilches-Landa provided a statement regarding the new express bus service between Palm Beach and St. Lucie counties. She announced that Palm Tran will soon launch the Port St. Lucie Express, connecting West Palm Beach to Port St. Lucie.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Recommend Approval of the Southeast Florida Transportation Council Agenda

Mr. Uhlir of the Palm Beach TPA asked whether the US-27 Connector item was a discussion or presentation.

Mr. Gies of the Broward MPO clarified it is a discussion, but historical context can be provided by Paul Flavien of the Broward MPO.

Mr. Jeffries of FDOT District 6 noted there are no updates besides the Planning and Conceptual Engineering (PAC)) study which was completed in 2013.

Mr. Gies stated the importance of connection for a commuter rail in Broward County.

Motion made by Mr. Jeffries, seconded by Ms. Handrahan, to approve the Southeast Florida Transportation Council Agenda. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously.

VIII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Update

Mr. Franco Saraceno of Kittleson & Associates presented on the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and timeline.

Mr. Gies asked for the timeline of the Palm Beach TPA's development of network coding status.

Mr. Uhlir stated it would be complete within the next two weeks.

B. Major Regional Corridors Discussion

Franchesa Taylor presented this item.

Mr. Jeffries asked if the PD&E study is included in the North Corridor project.

Mr. Gies noted only three phases are shown and it may be an issue that should be resolved with the Central Office of FDOT.

Mr. Flavien stated Power Line Rd from SW 10th Street to PBC line is a priority for Broward County and asked whether that is a priority in Palm Beach County. Mr. Uhlir noted that is a priority.

Mr. Uhlir asked what funding source is being allocated for the projects mentioned. Mr. Gies clarified that the US 27 study is state funded.

Mr. Flavien asked how Miami-Dade plans to show US-27 in its plan. Ms. Taylor noted they have the iron triangle included but not rail corridor.

Chairperson Vilches-Landa stated there will be a discussion with FDOT about project inclusion in their LRTP as they approve their deadline.

Mr. Jeffries noted it should be included as a cost estimate.

Mr. Gies stated the importance of including this because plans for Commuter Rail north of Miami-Dade County need to include freight, per FEC.

Mr. Gies stated a feasibility study would be included.

Mr. Flavien said there are ongoing efforts with FDOT District 4 and District 6 to classify US-27 as part of the national highway freight network which

could provide funding for the corridor.

Mr. Uhlir asked whether grade separation is being discussed in Broward or Miami. Mr. Gies stated Broward presented projects that are regional in nature including SFRC and FEC grade separation.

C. Discussion of 2045 Multimodal Regional Corridors Network

Chairperson Vilches-Landa initiated the discussion by providing background on the development of the 2045 Multimodal Regional Corridors Network. She explained that since 2019, the regional corridor map has been in use, outlining various regional facilities, including rail lines and waterways. The map has served as a foundational tool for regional planning and funding decisions.

The Chairperson Vilches-Landa noted a specific issue raised by FDOT District 6 regarding the omission of the Palmetto Station from the regional map. Although the Metrorail line is depicted, individual stations like Palmetto are not clearly shown. FDOT suggested that clarification is needed to address this and ensure accurate representation of facilities eligible for regional funding.

Mr. Jeffries (FDOT District 6) explained that while the map was updated to include major rail lines such as CSX and Brightline, specific stations were not added. He emphasized the importance of ensuring that key stations like Palmetto are reflected on the map.

Mr. Edmonson (DTPW) highlighted the precedent set by past projects, noting that funding has been awarded to other stations and corridors despite similar mapping omissions. He cited the Palmetto Intermodal Terminal, which received funding in 2021 even though the station wasn't explicitly marked on the map. The inherent understanding was that stations are integral to the system and therefore eligible for funding.

Mr. Calvaresi (Broward MPO) supported the idea of ensuring clarity and consistency in the criteria for designating regional networks and associated facilities. He mentioned previous discussions with FDOT and underscored the importance of clear guidelines for funding eligibility.

Ms. Bush (FDOT District 4) agreed to review statutory guidelines to ensure proper alignment with funding processes and promised to share additional details regarding the legal framework for regional entities setting priorities for trip funding. She also suggested that enhancements to the

communication around the inclusion of stations and connectors to corridors could be beneficial for future planning.+*

Ms. Delaney stated that it was an omission that Metrorail is not listed as an urban fixed guideway system and questioned why it cannot be.

Chairperson Vilches-Landa noted the 2050 plan will not be adopted for another year so any application regarding Metrorail would not qualify.

Ms. Delaney said we have precedent, and we should amend the map to include Metrorail and clarify the language.

Mr. Calvaresi stated changing the memo that has been in effect for 5 years is not effective.

Mr. Jeffries expressed that it was be helpful to add this clarifying information and the FDOT District 6 Secretary requested Metrorail be shown on the map with this single station.

Ms. Delaney noted it is ineffective to show a single station and an illustrative list could show every single station.

Motion made by Mr. Gies, seconded by Ms. Delaney to amend the multimodal regional corridors network to include additional language in number 5 in the 2045 refined network criteria to read "All active rail lines and passenger rail stations that are not part of the SIS, not abandoned, and not rail spurs; (2) All Tri-Rail station; and (3) all Brightline stations; (4) all Metrorail stations. In a voice vote, the **motion** passed unanimously. Chairperson Vilches-Landa referred to the original motion to approve SEFTC agenda, adding an action item to approve amending language on the 2045 regional multimodal corridor network of April 2019 on page 5, amending the language as agreed. Motion made by Mr. Jeffries and seconded by Ms. Handrahan. In a voice note, the **motion** passed unanimously.

I. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

• Chair María Teresita Vilches-Landa called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

II. ROLL CALL

 No formal roll call was conducted due to the virtual format. Members were requested to enter their names and agency affiliations into the chat for recordkeeping purposes.

III. REVIEW OF AGENDA

• The agenda was reviewed without objections or proposed modifications from attendees.

IV. REVIEW OF MINUTES – Meeting of July 12, 2024, and September 11, 2024

• The review of minutes from July 12, 2024, meeting was postponed. The approval of these minutes will be deferred to the next in-person meeting.

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS

A. Cesar Martinez, FDOT District 4

 Commented on action item VIII.A regarding the Project Development &Environment (PD&E) study for US-27, recommending a multi-modal planning study as the next step rather than a PD&E study. This approach would align with the Broward MPO's Draft 2050 MTP, which prioritizes such planning studies.

B. Ken Jeffries, FDOT District 6

1. Supported the recommendation for a multi-modal planning study before any PD&E rail study for US-27.

VI. COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR

- Chair Vilches provided updates on ridership improvements in Miami-Dade, which saw an 11.3% increase. She acknowledged the efforts made to recover transit ridership post-pandemic and expressed positive remarks about the system's ongoing growth.
- Remarks were made on the effects of Hurricane Milton, extending wellwishes to affected areas.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. <u>Consensus to Recommend</u> resolution language to the Southeast Florida Transportation Council (SEFTC) requesting the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) program a Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study for the implementation of rail along the US-27 corridor from Miami-Dade to Palm Beach County

Discussion highlighted the intent to encourage FDOT to consider future rail implementation through a PD&E study along the US-27 corridor from Miami-Dade to Palm Beach County.

Discussion Points:

- Peter Gies (Broward MPO) sought clarification on project phases and funding for follow-up stages post-study.
- Paul Flavien emphasized that the resolution would support SEFTC's advocacy for the corridor, without enforcing a strict timeline.
- Ken Jeffries advised that planning studies ensure community support and address any "fatal flaws" before advancing to PD&E studies.
- Outcome: The resolution language will be moved forward as a recommendation to SEFTC without specifying a timeline.

B. <u>Consensus to Recommend Agenda of the Southeast Florida</u> Transportation Council (SEFTC) Meeting for October 18, 2024

- 1. The agenda for the SEFTC meeting on October 18, 2024, was reviewed with no objections.
- 2. Outcome: Consensus reached to recommend the SEFTC agenda.

VIII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. RTTAC & SEFTC Calendar Year 2025

- 1. Malcolm Moyse Jr. presented the draft calendar for 2025, detailing planned RTTAC meetings and major transportation organization events. He clarified that calendar invites would not be sent; members are encouraged to add dates manually to avoid conflicts.
- 2. Members are asked to review and suggest any modifications by the following week.

B. Transportation Regional Incentive Program (TRIP)- Workshop

1. Jessica Beck Galindo (District 6) and Sabrina Aubrey (District 4) presented on the TRIP application process for 2025. Key updates include page limits for applications, eligibility criteria, and procedural timelines.

Discussion Points:

- Members were reminded to adhere to the February 28, 2025, application deadline.
- The importance of confirming TRIP eligibility through SEFTC approval and detailed financial planning was emphasized.
- Members were encouraged to start early in the GAP system to avoid lastminute issues.
- Chair Vilches mentioned that the first draft will be discussed during the next meeting and adoption will be during the January meeting.

C. 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Update

- 1. Regional Network Cross-County Line Projects Overview
 - Jessica Josselyn presented the cross-county project analysis between Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach counties, outlining key projects on University Drive, I-95, Turnpike, and West Dixie Highway.

2. Scenario and Modeling Update

 Updates were given on scenario planning and accessibility analysis, emphasizing collaborative development to ensure continuity across county borders.

3. Revenue and Finance Update

- Jill Quigley provided insights on the revenue forecast for 2050, noting a conservative estimate due to changes in funding sources and allocation methods. Discussions highlighted the impact of reduced revenue projections on project feasibility.
- Members discussed the implications of declining gas tax revenues with increasing electric vehicle (EV) adoption, proposing further attention to sustainable funding strategies.
